Annual Membership Drive

It's time to pay Joslyn annual membership dues for 2022 – they are due in the month of January and of course are good for the whole year. The budget established in November held per-person dues at \$50 which can be paid by check (mailed, dropped through slot near conference room door, or handed to Karren in the office), cash (preferably directly to

Karren so she can give you a receipt) or online from our home page, http://joslynrec.org/, via PayPal (either from your PayPal account or on any credit card) which runs slightly higher as we are charged for the service (\$52 for one member, \$103 for two).

We are so grateful for our member contributions; both regular dues and donations of varying types throughout the year by individuals and from the clubs. It makes a **giant** difference in our ability to manage the facility well!

2021 was not easy for many clubs (and some members). While 2022 looks to start a bit better (last year at this time, we were not allowed to be in the building at all!), there are definitely still challenges to be faced such as masking concerns and hesitancy to gather indoors. We continue to hope for the best (despite the current elevated Covid risk) and encourage patience to allow those clubs who aren't back in action (or only partially back) to have the time to reshape, regroup and/or reinvigorate as needed. The notion that annual JRC dues don't provide as much to members as they used to because folks aren't in the building as often is understandable. Your board of directors believes that there continues to be good value in keeping the JRC financially healthy during ongoing hard times for a relatively small annual fee even if every member is not able to participate in activities as much as they did in 2019. Our facility needs all the attention a 50-ish year old building with hundreds of weekly users demands whether we are collectively playing in it 15 hours per week or 105 hours per week (our biggest expenses are nearly identical year to year regardless of member use including rent/property tax, insurance, utilities and a payroll for our part time office manager).

Thanks for your ongoing support of the Joslyn Center and please consider rejoining in 2022 if you haven't been a member in the most recent year or two.
