

We are introducing two NEW and substantial improvements to the Joslyn Center: remotely controlled shades for the Main Hall skylights (to be installed shortly), and two large screen TVs which are already mounted. The shades will look like this:



Now, a short note from Mark Kantor, immediate past president of JRC, on the TVs: You may have seen the two large TVs mounted in the main hall and conference room. Many thanks to Richard and Shirley Paulson Lee and the Cambria Lions Club for their donation of these TVs. They will be replacing our old LCD projector and are a huge step up in brightness (no more dimming the lights) and will provide multiple state of the art ways to share visuals, audio, text or streaming content.

## Friday Night Ecstatic Dance!

Inner Rhythm is a growing group of heart-centered-people who dance as a way of returning to our selves and to commune with each other. For us the dance floor is a playground, a teacher, a healer. There are no steps to follow, no right or wrong way to move, we dance to feel what is sacred through the movement of our bodies.

Inner Rhythm is a 70-90 minute dance journey. Every Inner Rhythm dance is different but the basic format is the same. We start with slower fluid rhythms, move into pulsing percussive beats, peak into wild chaos, then return with trance-like lyrical rhythms dissolving into a quiet gentle stillness. We finish with a short closing circle.
