GENERAL MEETING CLUB PRESIDENTS (or Representative) & EXECUTIVE BOARD**

1. **Called to order** at 9:31 a.m. by Byron Foster, President
2. **MINUTES** from 05-14-26 General Membership Meeting were approved as distributed.
3. **TREASURER'S REPORT** – presented by Bruce Nii.

Year-to-date, net income is \$2.2k favorable to budget. Total revenue exceeded budget by \$5.7k, primarily driven by club donations (\$3.2k), rental income (\$2.0k), and membership dues (\$0.5k). Year-to-date expenses were \$3.5k over budget, largely due to the security camera electrical upgrade (\$2.3k), CCSD water and sewer charges (\$0.9k), and legal expenses for 501(c)(3) research (\$0.4k).

After questions on the Profit & Loss Statement, Bruce explained that he separates electric expenses from PG&E expenses so that it's clearer to see when we disburse funds for an electrician vs. utilities. He also clarified that Workmen's Comp is paid out once a year rather than spread out monthly.

4. **BUILDING FACILITIES UPDATE/REPORT** – presented by Jeff LaChance (Second VP)

1) Jeff was called in, once again, to save the day when all the toilets were plugged. He called a plumber and a paper towel blockage was the culprit. Jeff is recommending that the plumber comes out twice a year to check the lines to avoid this from happening in the future. 2) Jeff changed all the smoke detector and clock batteries. 3) Jeff and Mark Kantor are trying to figure out why our cameras are blacking out periodically. Their first attempt to rectify the problem is to turn the cameras off for 20-30 seconds once a week and then to turn them back on. We'll wait with anticipation to see this saga unfold.

5. **CLUB PRESIDENTS'/REPRESENTATIVES' REPORTS** 1) **Lawn Bowls** will be hosting a pairs tournament July 18-19, which should bring in 40-50 people (including local members, national, and international players.) Ian shared that because their tournaments attract visitors to Cambria, the Cambria Tourism Board provides funding to help cover expenses, such as their new Lawn Bowls sign. They continue to beautify their area and are currently completing their back fence and deck. Ian reported that he and several other members have experience obtaining 501(c)(3) status and offered to assist the JC Executive Board with the process. He asked Steve Dowding, from Cambria Chorale, if they might perform at their tournament in March. 2) **Poker** members were glad to welcome two new couples last month, and they were drawn in because they saw our beautiful banners out front. Their next tournament is scheduled for Saturday, July 11, in the Main Hall. They'll be playing Texas Hold 'Em with a \$20 buy in. 3) **Tai Chi** is going strong with 44 members. Barry is offering a new cycle in beginner classes, and he shared that he is changing his teaching techniques by slowing things down and covering the basics, resulting in members enjoying the classes. 4) **Bridge** is enjoying around 42 members, and Iggy presented Bruce with a \$500 donation during our meeting. Thank you, Bridge Club. 5) **Fishing Club** will be "catching" everyone's attention during the Pinedorado Parade again this year with their boat entry. Michael informed us that the Coastal Discovery Center (located on the William Randolph Hearst Memorial Beach in San Simeon) will be celebrating its 20th anniversary on Saturday, July 18, from

11:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m., and the Fishing Club will be on hand with fishing tackle and supplies to let people try their hand at fishing. They'll be able to use some of the equipment that was donated to them by the California State Parks System. 6) Pilates is enjoying a steady group and everyone seems to enjoy it. 7) Dancercise & Weights continues to attract strong attendance, and donations reached a record \$644 last month. 8) Inner Rhythm is helping its members stay healthy through movement/dance. Steve informed us that Harvard University did research and found that even moving 30 seconds after sitting for a while can help improve circulation and provide a small metabolic boost each time you start moving. 9) Table Tennis added two new members recently, bringing their membership to 42. All three tables remain busy, with members socializing while waiting for their turn to rotate into play. 10) Chorale is enjoying a nice summer break, but Ron Perry, their wonderful conductor, is feeding them music and videos to whet their appetites for their upcoming Christmas concerts. Rehearsals will resume on August 18, and tentative concert dates have been set for December 6 and 13. 11) Rough Writers will be represented at the Cambria Writer's Weekend hosted by Salty Pages Bookstore on July 25 & 26 from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Catherine Ryan Hyde (author of *Pay it Forward*) will be their guest author.

6. **VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT**—presented by Annie Jones
Annie has been busy in her “easy” role as VP. In the last few months, she has taken over for Byron while he was on an extended vacation, typed the newsletter, took minutes for Shelly on two different occasions, and has prepared payroll. It's no wonder she has dubbed herself the “Backup Queen.” We all agreed it was the ideal title—it perfectly reflects her ability to do it all.
